Honduras is a conservative society, in its attire and mannerisms. We need to observe greater discretion with our attire than we do at home.

- ◆ Shirts must be worn at all times, T-shirts are acceptable.
- ◆ Overly exposing items need to be avoided. These include halters, camisoles, tank tops, sports bras worn as an outer garment, and bare midriffs. Also avoid shorts with an inseam less than 4 inches, low-riding pants or shorts, Spandex clothing, and bike pants or shirts.
- ◆ Any attire expressing alcohol, beer or tobacco slogans and obscenities is not permitted.
- ◆ Body piercing and tattoos are associated with gangs in Honduras, so it is suggested that any facial rings are removed, men remove earrings and that clothing covers any tattoos.
- ◆ When wearing a bathing suit, be sure to wear a shirt or cover up until you are in the pool area. This includes the hotel lobby and all stairways.
- ◆ When leaving the hotel, walking shorts or jeans are acceptable attire.
- ◆ When attending church, it is suggested that women wear a dress/skirt or long pants and men wear long pants. Jeans are acceptable.

Remember that we are modeling Christ and representing Liberty Corner Presbyterian Church and the United States during our stay in Honduras. We stand out for many reasons – not limited to our physical appearance and the clothes we wear.
